This greeting from Christ, "Peace be with you," is a gift we share with one another as we worship. In times of great stress and difficult struggle, we all need to be reminded of the promise of peace Jesus offers to his troubled disciples in the experience of resurrection. The Spirit of Christ is seen, heard, and felt as we offer this blessed assurance, the peace of the Lord, to all who gather in his name.

In difficult financial times, we servants of God are reminded of this promise of peace and we remember that God "owns it all." We are stewards entrusted to manage God's estate.

Servanthood and stewardship go together, since God expects us to be trustworthy in both. The words "Financial" and "Peace" also go together when we discover how to be faithful servants and wise stewards in managing the resources God has entrusted to us. Would you like to experience financial peace?

Financial Peace University is a tool that supports churches by equipping them with biblically based accountability instruction that trains individuals and families in the congregation to manage God given resources. The class is taught by Dave Ramsey by way of DVD, followed by a small group discussion. Each session last two hours: one hour for the video lesson and one hour for the small group discussion.

The Saint John's Church Council unanimously

endorses this program as a next step in the spiritual growth and development of our congregation's life and ministry. Financial Peace University will begin on Sunday, March 1, the first Sunday in Lent. The season of Lent is a time of spiritual preparation as we journey together toward Holy Week and Easter. This congregational commitment to grow deeper in our understanding of stewardship will encourage us through God's word and support us in our mission and ministry.

## "Peace Be With You!"

Did you know there are over 800 Scriptures regarding personal finance? To become a faithful servant and to experience financial peace, we have to settle the issue of money in our life. Jesus said, "No servant can serve two masters... You cannot serve both God and Money." Living for ministry and living for money are

mutually exclusive goals. Which one will you choose?

Money has the greatest potential to replace God in your life. More people are sidetracked from serving by materialism and debt than by anything else. If you are feeling disturbed and distracted by financial worries, Financial Peace University is an opportunity to walk together and encourage one another as we learn life changing biblical principles of personal finance and faithful stewardship.

## UPDATE:

**Daniel Dougherty** has been with us every Sunday, sitting in our Welcome Center, watching the service on TV and drinking coffee. Recently Daniel was identified as one of the top 10 chronically homeless in Knoxville. This means that all of the service agencies cooperate and focus their efforts at getting Daniel off the street and into housing. Ron Wollard of All Souls Church has taken an active interest in helping Daniel, as have the staff and members of St. John's. Recently Daniel received an ID card and the next step is to get him an apartment with supportive services. In addition, another Support Circle (made up of members & staff of SJLC partnering with members of All Souls Church), has been established to create a support system for Daniel. It is our hope and prayer that Daniel will become another statistic – a **formerly** chronically homeless person.

On November 2, 2008 Bishop Julian Gordy joined the members and friends of SJLC at a luncheon for the 120th Anniversary of SJLC. In his own words, he describes a portion of his experience:

"...One of the members of St. John's extended family is a young man named Daniel. He is tall and thin, has long red hair and a beard. Put him in a robe and he'd look like one of those northern European depictions of Jesus from my childhood Sunday School curriculum. He answers as briefly as possible when asked a question, but he is not a person with whom you are likely to have much of a conversation.

After worship, I was ushered to the table reserved for honored guests. There sat Daniel negotiating a plate mounded with food. He had chosen to sit at the head table. No one asked him to move. Instead, with no fanfare, one of the other head table guests had given up her place to Daniel. That seems to be how they do things at St. John's.

And that is how I came to eat lunch in the Kingdom of God. Sitting there between Carl Schalk and Daniel, two of God's beloved children, I savored a little foretaste of the feast to come, when all God's children will sit down together and enjoy the Creator forever at a table at which God makes a special place for those we tend to overlook..."

### A STEPHEN MINISTER IS...

- A child of God who walks beside a person who is hurting
- A congregation member with gifts for Caregiving who was carefully selected to serve in this role
- A lay person who has received 50 hours of training in providing emotional and spiritual care
- A caring, Christian friend who listens, cares, prays, supports, and encourages
- Someone who will "be there" for his or her care receiver, meeting faithfully for about an hour each week, for as long as there's a need

### 2008 Ends on a High Note

2008 had a few challenging moments from a financial perspective. We struggled for sufficient cash which required the access of \$95,000 of our \$100,000 line of credit. We changed financial systems and struggled for several months to recover administratively. But as always, God provides! December was an amazing month of generous offerings. We finished the year with a \$33,000 surplus in our operating bank account. We used \$25,000 of this to pay down our line of credit in January. Thanks be to God!

### 2009 Plan of Ministry

During November and December, the SJLC Church Council communicated to our members that our 2009 Plan of Ministry was projecting a \$67,000 deficit. A request for prayer and consideration of estimates of giving was made. As a result, the number of estimate of giving cards submitted increased to 138. In addition, many members gave graciously during November and December. As stated above, this yielded a \$33,000 surplus at year end. This, coupled with our increase in estimate of giving, has reduced the deficit to a more comfortable level. We will, however, continue to use discretion in spending as we need to under spend the budgeted amount.

### Believing, Belonging, and Becoming (BBB) Hits Halfway Point in Giving

Through 2008, approximately \$500,000 has been given by our congregation to the BBB Capital Campaign. In addition, St. John's Lutheran Church is the recipient of a grant from the Cornerstone Foundation of \$100,000 over the next three years. The two together represent 1/2 of our \$1.2 million goal for income.

During the next few months a major transformation will take place on the new property we have purchased. This will make a huge difference in our 5th and Broadway neighborhood. We all need to continue to pray for this project and the ministry impact in our neighborhood.

### WOW gains momentum & is developing independent funding

Win Our World Urban Outreach Ministry (WOW) has obtained an employer identification number and a bank account. WOW is filing for tax exempt status as an independent entity from St. John's Lutheran Church. This is necessary in order to allow WOW to apply for grants. Although WOW continues to be a ministry of SJLC, this ministry will be considered a separate legal entity for reporting purposes. This means that if you want to donate to SJLC and designate your contribution for WOW, SJLC will acknowledge your contribution on your giving statement and forward the funds to the WOW ministry. Either way, your contributions to this growing ministry are welcome.

## Sacred Listening Circles

Have you been searching for a way to discern God's will and movement in your life? Sacred Listening Circles are small communities for discernment that can assist you.

Spiritual discernment is the process of paying prayerful attention to God's movement in our lives as we seek clarity for God's will. Sacred Listening Circles, some times known as group spiritual direction, are small groups that prayerfully support one another in this awareness. Together the group, usually four to five people, seeks the Spirit's guidance for wisdom through a format of prayerful silence, Scripture reflection, listening to each other and thoughtful response. This spiritual community and its collective wisdom become a place for discernment in our lives.

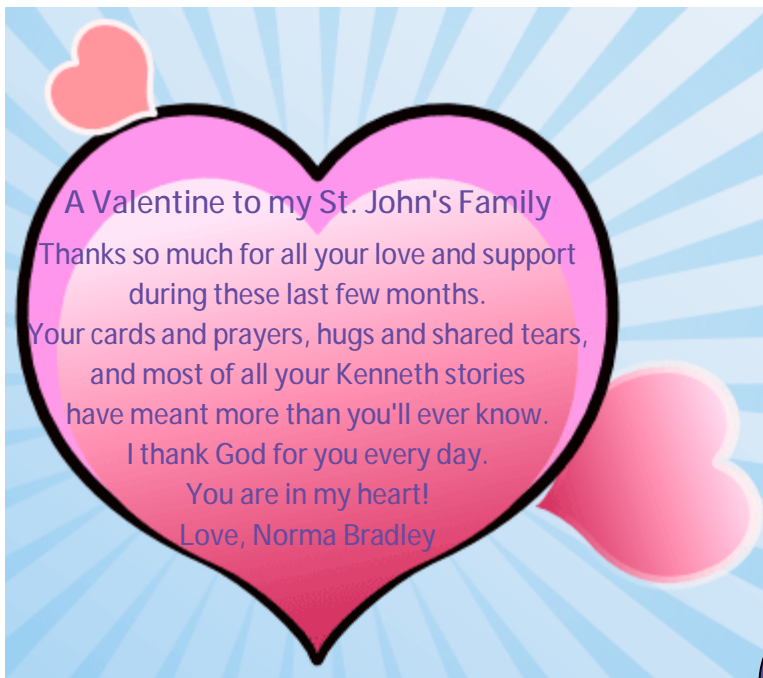

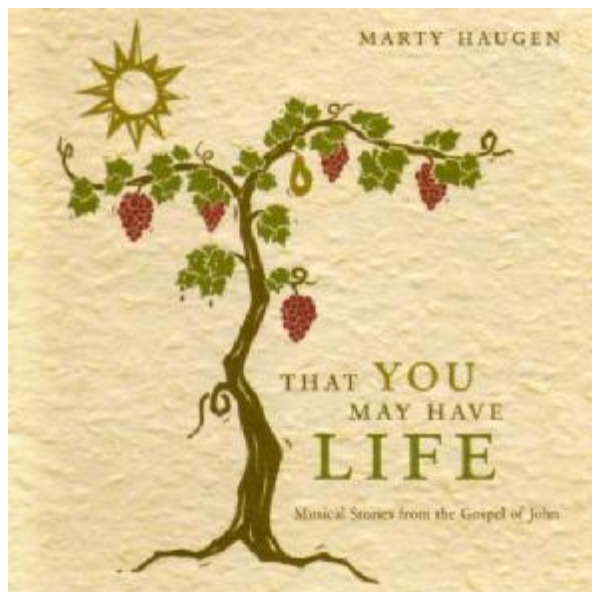
